Southern Circular Monogram, early style. This monogram was used on steam locomotives and freight equipment until the late 1940s. For steam locomotive application, the monogram was imitation gold throughout with no fill colors. This monogram was applied in the panel just forward of the cab window. This decoration was primarily for passenger locomotives, although a few yard switchers received the monogram. Although there might have been other freight engines, besides switchers with the monogram, photo evidence does not show the monogram on road engines as a practice. When used, the monogram was either 20" or 13" in diameter. The exception to the cab location was streamlined locomotive 1380, which had the monogram on the forward cylinder cover. These graphics are not to railroad scale, but can be resized as long as dimensions are maintained. I will provide these drawings in DECAL Artwork scale.
