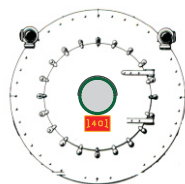
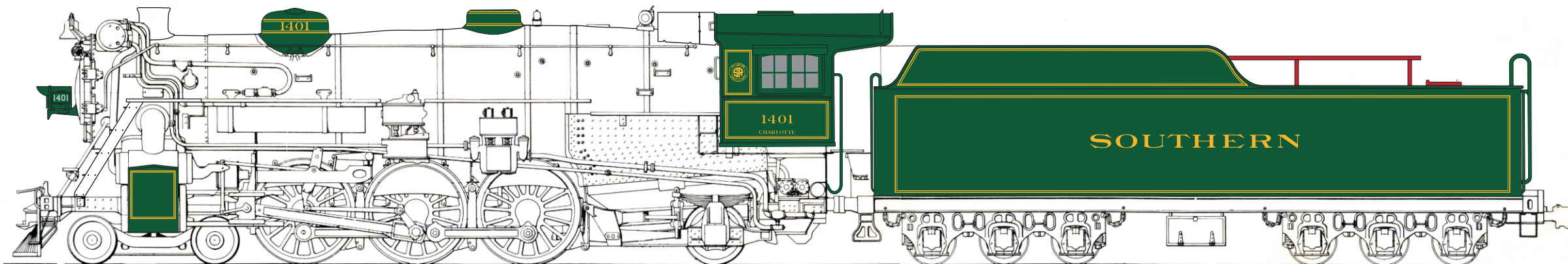

The above illustration depicts Southern Railway 4-6-2 PS-4 #1401 as she currently appears on display at the Smithsonian in Washington, D.C. When 1401 was retired from regular service, she wore single gold stripes in lieu of the double stripes on the display engine. Also, I am informed that her number plate was green rather than red now on display. Photos of the late 1940s show Southern locomotives with their tender backboards and tender decks painted red, or oxide red for safety purposes. It is not clear whether or not all engines wore these safety colors. See Southern Railway Drawing SL-6129, dated 1927 for location and dimensions of Southern Passenger Locomotive Lettering. The above lettering is HO Scale. I will provide these graphics in DECAL artwork for scales N, HO, S & O. This drawing is an elevation drawing with my graphics artwork super-imposed.
